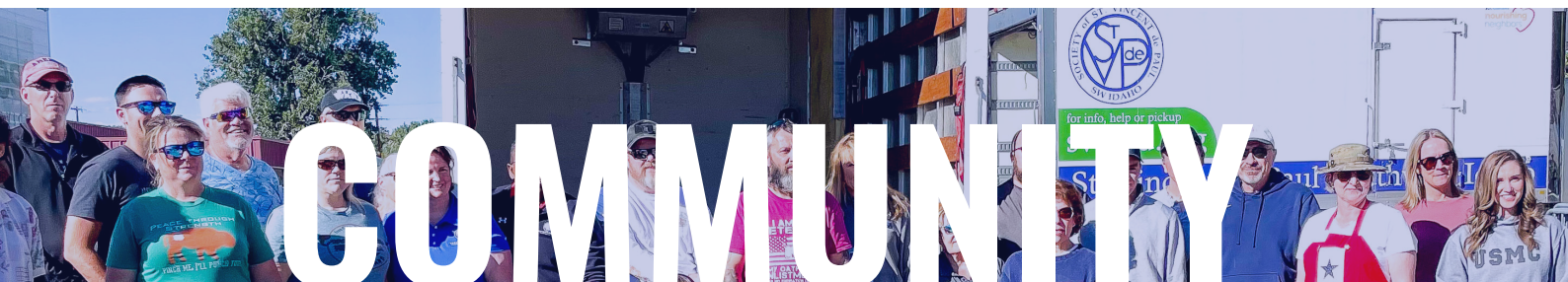

Our thrift story begins early in 1976. At that time, the priests of the greater Boise area commissioned Jim Kelsch to do a survey of our state and the other states surrounding Idaho to determine how other Catholic parishes met the needs of God's poor. All of the area priests wanted one visible, safe place to send the people who were in need of various kinds of aid. Thus, the first St. Vincent de Paul store came to be.

Today, St. Vincent de Paul operates six thrift stores, five food pantries, and a variety of programs to support our neighbors in need across southwest Idaho.

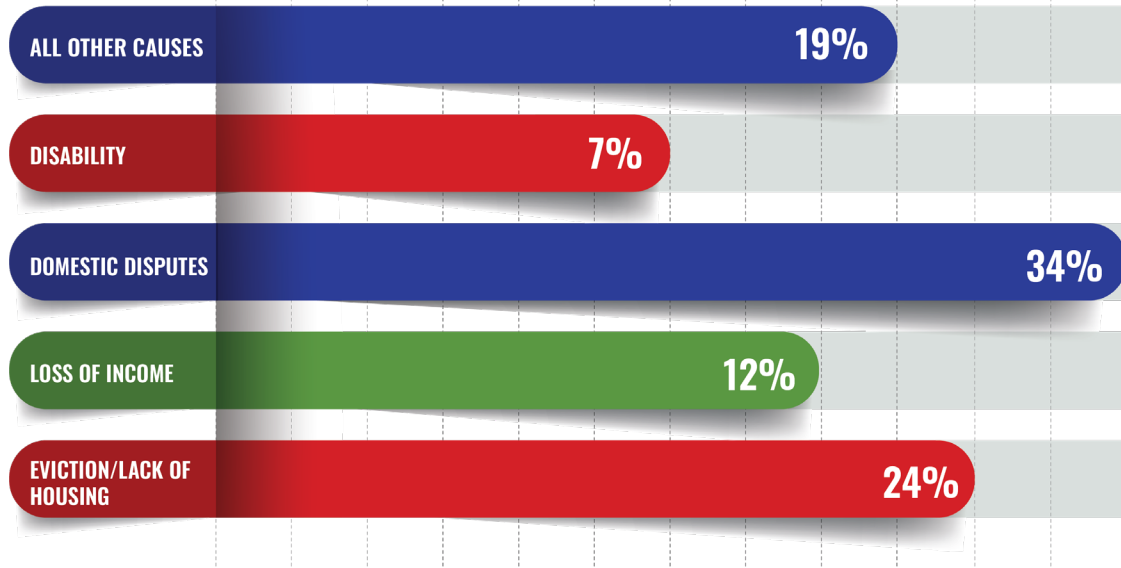

FOCUSING ON PREVENTION

Primary Causes of Homelessness in Idaho*



The Mission of St. Vincent de Paul Southwest Idaho... In Action!

Disability: Tom** the husband of a couple with 2 children had both knees replaced and will need surgery to fuse his spine. The couple receives Supplemental Security Income (SSI), and the wife has a job with a call center; however, she suffers from migraines which sometimes interfere with work. We helped them with electricity bills of \$1,580 to keep the lights on in the home.

Loss of Income: Joe** had lost his job and had multiple hospitalizations the past year. By the time his wife got a job, the couple was behind with the rent and car payments. We were able to provide \$1,322 in direct assistance for those outstanding bills to help the family stay housed.

Eviction: April** was on the verge of eviction but her landlord said he wouldn't evict her if she paid the rent, which we paid. We also helped her purchase a good used car from an acquaintance for \$600. This aid helped April remain housed and provided her with reliable transportation to and from work



ROSE'S STORY

Living with a monthly income of \$1,521, Rose was devastated to learn that her current rent was being increased to \$675 per month. After waiting several years for Section 8 Housing, Rose had finally been accepted for low-income housing. With only two days' notice, Rose was unable to pay the security deposit for her new apartment. She reached out to St. Vincent de Paul to assist with this fee. We were able to help her pay the deposit, as well as help her move her belongings into her new home. Rose is happy to be in her new apartment and is able to pay her rent, which is now \$399 per month.

Who We Are

At St. Vincent de Paul: We help people in need by assisting with food, housing expenses, clothing, furniture, and other basic human needs through your generous donations of goods, food, volunteer time, and financial support. Together, we work to prevent homelessness in Southwest Idaho. St. Vincent de Paul Southwest Idaho is comprised of eleven conferences (local working groups), six thrift stores, five food pantries, two reentry facilities, and a variety of seasonal programs. Our services would not be possible without our gracious volunteers who respond to requests for help, support their local food pantry, and provide other volunteer assistance as needed. During our nearly 6,000 annual home visits, we listen carefully to our neighbors in need.

Everyone has a unique situation, story, and struggle. That's why we strive to customize the assistance to meet the needs of our neighbors. St. Vincent de Paul operates five food pantries, located throughout the Treasure Valley to meet the greatest need. With the onset of the pandemic, we quickly realized that we would need to change operations as well as look for ways to meet an increase in demand for services. We adapted by adding a drive-through model with minimal interaction during visits to our food pantries. During this time, we realized that many clients still were unable to physically visit our locations. In response to these barriers, we initiated a mobile food operation, where food boxes are delivered directly to low-income housing complexes.

St. Vincent de Paul has six thrift stores whose clothing, household goods, and financial proceeds support our programs. Seasonally, we support our neighbors in need through the Thanksgiving Food Box Program, and Christmas Toy Store. Our Reentry Services Program provides welcoming and coaching for people coming out of the prison system. The program is focused on providing support for people re-entering the community with a longer-term goal of reducing recidivism. St. Vincent de Paul Southwest Idaho, with our network of friends, is focused on building a more just world through personal relationships with and in service to people in need.

Offering a Personal Approach

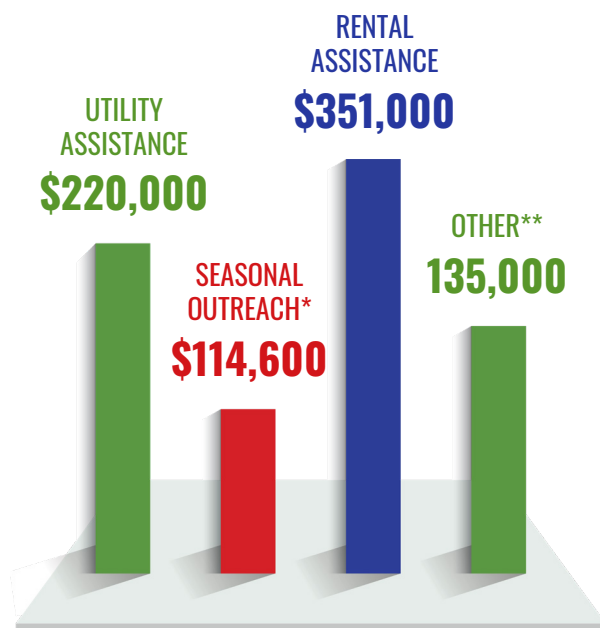
HOME VISITS

Our core service is to provide assistance on a person-to-person basis. A Home Visit consists of a pair of volunteers visiting clients' homes to discuss their specific needs and offer support in various ways.



Through the Home Visit Program, we provide direct financial assistance to our neighbors in need. This assistance can be used to help with utility bills and rent when eviction is imminent. This personal approach gives the Home Visitor a unique perspective and stronger understanding. This program allows us to offer additional assistance that may be needed, such as food, clothing, and furniture.

The St. Vincent de Paul Southwest Idaho Food Pantries were met with a variety of challenges in 2021. From the nationwide supply chain shortages to vast increases in the need for our Mobile Food Pantry, our volunteers spent over 30,000 hours helping us feed our community.

The Mobile Food Pantry began in 2020, in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. UNMET NEEDS to reach our neighbors who have fallen through the cracks in our community and struggle to access existing food pantries. Many clients are single mothers, refugees, veterans, migrant laborers, and seniors.

None of our food operations would be possible without our volunteers, community partners, and the help of our supporters. We thank you for your financial support, because of you we will continue to expand our reach.

The services we provide work toward actively reducing recidivism, while aiding in a productive transition back into the community. In turn, working toward our mission of preventing homelessness.

BRYAN'S STORY

Bryan was incarcerated for 10 years through the Idaho Department of Corrections. After being released in June 2019, Bryan went to live with his brother. Knowing that living situation would not be beneficial to his reentry, Bryan made the move to Boise but was still unable to find work. Bryan reached out to St. Vincent de Paul and was put in contact with Cindi, the Reentry Employment Specialist. Bryan and Cindi worked together, ultimately finding Bryan a position with Chris Reeve Knives, located in Boise, ID. When accepting the position, Anne (Owner of Chris Reeves Knives) made a lasting impression on Bryan, stating: “I can give grace, because grace was given to me.”

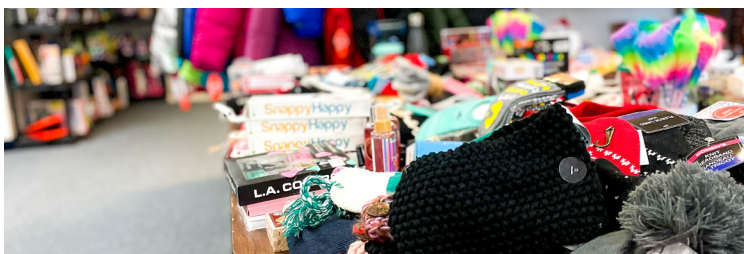

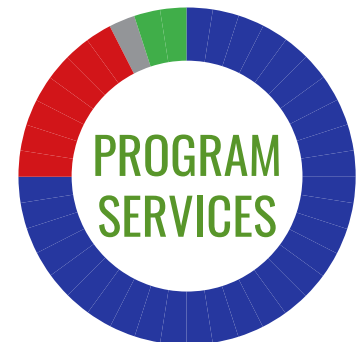
