

With the commitment of 11 dedicated conferences (local working groups) and the unwavering support of our volunteer community, our outreach extends to a diverse range of individuals and families in need. This includes operating and maintaining five essential food pantries and six thrift stores, which serve as lifelines for numerous residents facing various hardships. In our ongoing efforts, we have established two reentry services offices, offering critical assistance to individuals navigating the challenging journey of reintegrating into society after incarceration.

Our impact extends across crucial regions within the community, including Boise, Meridian, Nampa, Caldwell, and Mountain Home. This extensive coverage ensures that your contributions generate a profound and far-reaching impact, significantly enhancing the lives of our local neighbors throughout the Treasure Valley. OUR REACH



Deciding whether to pay your rent or buy groceries for your family is a position all too familiar. We focus on meeting basic human needs with an open heart, on a person-to-person basis.

Through our network of volunteers and supporters, we provide food, clothing, and direct financial assistance to those in need, as well as aid to our neighbors as they reenter the community after serving time incarcerated.

Meet Alma

"I have three kids who were in foster care since I didn't have a place to live. I am also caring for my dad, who has dementia. It has been rough. St. Vincent de Paul and the Home Visit Program helped me pay the deposit for my apartment. Having a place to live meant getting extended visits with my kids, and that meant more to me than anything. SVdP also helped with furniture and beds for my kids. Now I am working to get them back with me full time, something that seemed so far out of reach not that long ago. I am so thankful that SVdP was there when I needed help."



HOME VISITS

At St. Vincent de Paul, we specialize in providing personalized assistance through our Home Visits. We prioritize helping individuals and families maintain stable housing situations. Through our personal approach, our Home Visitors gain a unique perspective that enables them to offer additional assistance that may be needed, like food or clothing and furniture vouchers.

Our primary focus is on preventing homelessness by providing direct assistance, including help with utility bills and rent when eviction is imminent. When individuals or families in need reach out to us through our Help Line, St. Vincent de Paul volunteers visit them in their homes to determine how we can best assist them.

"We were only eating once or twice a week, but we always made sure our baby had WIC. I called St. Vincent de Paul and said, "I can't drive. I'm legally blind in one eye and can't make it to the Food Pantry. Is there anyway you can bring some food to the hotel we are living in? I have a one-month old, and my husband was at work... we're in desperate need right now." Later that day, they let me know that they could bring food to me at 12:30 pm. We have the bare necessities, so the food and the SVdP clothing and furniture vouchers really saved our family. We are so thankful."

FOOD PANTRIES



For many families, their grocery budget is often stretched to its limit to make ends meet. At St. Vincent de Paul Food Pantries, we make it our mission to address this basic human need with empathy and personal attention. Our commitment to sustainability is reflected in our partnership with multiple community organizations, enabling us to provide our neighbors with fresh and nutritious food consistently.

Our food pantries are located in densely populated regions of the Treasure Valley, including Boise, Meridian, Nampa, Caldwell, and Mountain Home. Our devoted volunteers sort and distribute the food items to ensure that individuals and families in need receive the necessary assistance.

I got connected to the staff here, so now I can volunteer every day and give back to the community I've been part of for so long. And, for me, that's a good thing. I get to be a part of helping people coming out see the resources available to them. We have the resources and the desire to help. REENTRY SERVICES

St. Vincent de Paul's Reentry Services provide vital support to individuals who are transitioning back into society after being incarcerated. With a deep understanding of the challenges that come with reentry, our dedicated volunteers and staff members, many of whom have personal experience with incarceration, offer a unique and compassionate approach to supporting those in need. Our services include pick up from prison upon release, first day out services such as food, clothing vouchers, and bus passes.

THANKSGIVING FOOD BOX PROGRAM

The Thanksgiving Food Box Program, a long-standing St. Vincent de Paul tradition, embodies the heartwarming spirit of helping families in our community experiencing financial challenges enjoy a Thanksgiving meal. This family-to-family act of charity is about neighbors extending a helping hand to one another. This program remains a beacon of hope for all who partake in the Thanksgiving Food Box Program.

Every year, as Thanksgiving approaches, families in need can register to receive a Thanksgiving Food Box. Each box contains a turkey, potatoes, a roasting pan, and all the trimmings for a Thanksgiving meal, serving 4-6 people. SVdP volunteers collect, assemble, and distribute these food boxes to our community members on the Monday and Tuesday of Thanksgiving week, ensuring that those in need can partake in the holiday's warmth and togetherness.

CHRISTMAS TOY STORE

Each year, St. Vincent de Paul Southwest Idaho opens the Christmas Toy Store to families in need who cannot afford to purchase Christmas Gifts for their children. In partnership with local school counselors in Ada and Canyon County, we provide gifts at no out-of-pocket cost to families with children ages 0-18 to shop at our Christmas Toy Store. Our volunteers pre-register each family over the phone. During registration, volunteers help parents/guardians schedule an appointment to visit the nearest Toy Store locations and personally select gifts for their children in the weeks leading up to the Christmas holiday.
